INTRODUCTION

This conference is an introduction to the Digital Services Factory (DSF), a foundational, 'game-changing' initiative that re-frames the way public services are being delivered in a faster, smarter and scalable way, maximizing impact for government, citizens and businesses alike.

A vital component of Cyprus' Digital Agenda, the DSF project is implemented by the Deputy Ministry of Research, Innovation and Digital Policy (DMRID), in collaboration with the Government Digital Services (GDS) of the United Kingdom. Experts from GDS will be joining the DMRID Team in a series of interactive discussions aimed at presenting to the ICT industry the government's new citizen-centric approach to delivering digital services based on user needs, openness and transparency, setting the foundations for an elevated, more relevant and more efficient public-private partnership.

The agenda will focus on the process of revalidating the Ministry's enterprise architecture, competencies and service delivery model, and more specifically, on the Procurement Framework and Digital Service Standards Guidance, which support standardization of methodology and delivery across Government, in an effort to ensure uniformity and consistency and enable the private sector to actively participate in accelerating digitization of better, simpler and more user-friendly services.

Kyriacos Kokkinos Deputy Minister of Research, Innovation, and Digital Policy

Kyriacos Kokkinos is the Deputy Minister to the President for Research, Innovation and Digital Policy. He previously served as the Chief Scientist for Research & Innovation, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Research & Innovation Foundation and Member of the National Board of Research & Innovation. He is a distinguished professional with 30 years of experience in Executive Management, Technology and Business Consulting, in global corporations such as IBM Europe and PwC. He served at the Board of many Organisations, including Invest Cyprus, the Cyprus Tourism Organisation (CTO), the Cyprus Port Authority (CPA), and the Board of Trustees of the Cyprus Institute. He is the recipient of numerous awards and recognitions for professional excellence, including 'Business Leader of the Year Award' 2016 (CCCI) and 'Quality Leader Award 2015' (CQA). His Academic qualifications include Executive MBA in Strategic Management from Henley Management College (UK) and MSc & BSc in Electrical Engineering from New Jersey Institute of Technology (USA).



H.E. Stephen Lillie British High Commissioner to Cyprus

Stephen Lillie CMG was appointed British High Commissioner to Cyprus in April 2018. Previously he served as Director, Asia Pacific from July 2013 until April 2017. Stephen served as British Ambassador to the Philippines (2009-13); Head of the FCO Far Eastern Department (2006-2009); Director of Trade and Investment at the British High Commission New Delhi (2003-2006) and British Consul-General at Guangzhou, China (1999-2003). Previously, Stephen has also served in the European Union and Middle East Departments of the FCO and at the British Embassy Beijing. Stephen is a Chinese speaker, having studied the language in Hong Kong and London. He has a degree in Modern Languages from Oxford University.



Dr. Stelios Himonas

Permanent Secretary, Deputy Ministry of Research, Innovation and Digital Policy Stelios D. Himonas was born in Athens, Greece, on May 2, 1962. He received the BE, MS and PhD degrees from the State University of New York at Stony Brook, USA in 1985, 1986 and 1989, respectively, all in electrical engineering. From 1989 until 1997 he was an Associate Professor at the Department of Electrical Engineering at the New York Institute of Technology, USA. Also, from 1994 until 1997, he was collaborating with the Multimedia Communications Research Group of Bellcore's Applied Research Division in Morristown, New Jersey, USA. Dr. Himonas has published numerous research papers in refereed journals and conference proceedings in the fields of detection and multimedia communications. Also, during the period from 1989 until 1997 he served as a reviewer of research papers submitted for publication to Transactions of the IEEE and Proceedings of the IEE, as well as to various conferences in the field of communications. Currently he is the Permanent Secretary of the Deputy Ministry of Research, Innovation and Digital Policy. Prior to this position he was the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Energy, Commerce and Industry, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Justice and Public Order and the Director of the Department of Electronic Communications of the Republic of Cyprus. Also during the period from 2000 to 2003, he served on the Board of the Cyprus Telecommunications Authority. From 2006 until 2013, he held chairmanship and vice-chairmanship positions in European electronic communications committees. Since October 2012, he has been appointed by the Council of Ministers as the Digital Champion of Cyprus. Dr. Himonas is a member of the Sigma Xi and Eta Kappa Nu honor societies and the New York Academy of Sciences. He is listed in the Who is Who in the World, the Who is Who Among Human Services Professionals, the Who is Who in the East and the Who is Who in American Education.

Andriana Achilleos is the Director of the Department of Information Technology Services (DITS), at the Deputy Ministry of Research, Innovation and Digital Policy, since 15 October 2020.
